Superintendent's Highlights

Since 2003 our students in all three schools exceeded AYP, and in 2014 earned a 5 star rating in the NSPF. 100% of ECSD teachers are highly qualified, and continually monitor student achievement, and strive to improve instruction of standards to promote greater student learning. We use state of the art technologies including SmartBoards and 1:2 computers. We offer a comprehensive K-12 curriculum; and we have continued after-school tutoring programs and summer school at the three schools. We continue, for a sixth year, a 4-day school week to improve student and teacher attendance. It has been a popular success. We have a high level of parent involvement with nearly 100% of our parents attending school activities.
